#### CITATION:

This descriptive qualitative study investigates the impact of science teachers outsourced from other countries on learners' performance and factors that inspire them to teach effectively in Limpopo Province. Based on the poor performance of learners in science subjects, the study is guided by the Structural functionalist, Social constructivism and Community of practice theories. The research population comprises of 1200 science physical sciences learners, 80 outsourced teachers, 40 parents and 74 departmental officials at different levels from the eight newly demarcated districts of Limpopo Province. Data was collected using document analysis, focus-group interview. The study found out that more than 75% of schools that performed well in 2018 Grade 12 Physical Sciences in Limpopo are manned by outsourced teachers. The study also established several reasons why outsourced teachers, and recommended collaborative work approach among stakeholders for better academic performance in school sciences.

Title : Exploring Cultural Heritage Preservation Through Digitisation: A Case Study of Traditional Children's Games in Vhembe District, South Africa

The study attempted to bridge the gap between cultural practices and modernity, thus preserving and giving access to indigenous games through digitalization. The study is further premised that, today, most African children are exposed to Eurocentic ways of doing things and these are antithetic to traditional African norms and values. In precolonial Africa, indigenous games were used to instill values and Ubuntu to shape a better society. Without diminishing the role of elders, relationships and particularly the corpus in the transmission of knowledge, it is the central argument of the study that digitization can be used alongside traditional methods of knowledge transmission and preservation to fill the deficit in a social environment where knowledge on cultural practices is diminishing. Ms Madima's study is a scholarly contribution to the challenges and debates about preservation of indigenous games. She achieves this through a practical Afro-centric framework for re-discovering, preserving, reviving and shaping culturally responsive discourses and praxes in the arena of children's indigenous games.

Title : A Descriptive Analysis of Tshifasi: An Ordinary Musicological Study

Research shows that indigenous African music, like indigenous languages, encapsulates amongst others the behavioural patterns, values, and morals of cultural groups. In this study, Ms Madzivhandila investigated the *Tshifasi* music genre; its lyrical and functional potency in the moulding of intersex and social intelligence amongst Vhavenda youth. Basing her work on the Ordinary African Musicological theory and paradigm, she had successfully illuminated the musical intentions of *Tshifasi*. By so doing, she succinctly highlighted the unique features of Tshivenda culture, which when properly harvested, could contribute to sexual moral sensitivities. In this work, the voice of the practitioners, as well as those of the elders and knowledge holders are given prominence as way of 'musicologising' about *tshifasi*. Through this work, Ms Madzivhandila has successfully managed to enthrone African epistemology. Her work will undoubtedly form the basis for future research in the field. Most importantly, it will give currency to the propagation of an Ordinary African Musicology – a discipline free from the sins of the colonial and apartheid academic stereotypes.

#### CITATION

The study investigates the documentation strategies used for the preservation of the indigenous health knowledge of Vhomaine, from the categories of both the diviners and the herbalists, in its complete raw form for posterity. There has been paucity of evidence of the voices of Vhomaine documentation strategies. The data collected revealed that Vhomaine see visions, have dreams, and or go on a trance to come up with either a diagnosis or treatment or both and as such is not easy to record things as they occur. Of significance is that Vhomaine's secret knowledge is the truth behind the truth, the real fact behind the facts they want someone to believe. The study further militates against a narrow Western definition of literacy as the ability to read and write which is too colonial as a direct result of penury, colonialization, oppression, and imperialism, which limits people from becoming socially engaged citizens. There have also been calls for the infusion of the Euro-west documentation strategies into that of Vhomaine purported to be beneficial, more especially to the diviners since it may assist in mitigating against the challenges associated with the absence of documentation; and the implications for recognition, standardization and certification, which might be a contributory factor that threatens future traditional healing. Finally, there is a need for more studies based on Afrocentric research methodologies, which propose cultural and social immersion as opposed to scientific approaches to understand African phenomena such as traditional healing.

Title: Customary Marriages and Young Women's Sexual and Reproductive<br/>Health Rights in Makwarela (South Africa) and Concession (Zimbabwe)

Leah Gwatimba's thesis interrogates, compares, and analyses the effects of customary marriages on women's sexual and reproductive health rights and gender equality in Makwarela (South Africa) and Concession (Zimbabwe). She uses the key human rights principles of non-discrimination and gender equality to promote women's rights and emancipation, through the abolition of primordial cultural practices in customary marriages which infringe on the rights and dignity of young women. The study identifies obstacles to the realization of young women's sexual and reproductive health rights and interrogates power relations in customary marriages. The findings of the study highlighted that payment of roora/mamalo has a profound impact on the power dynamics in the family which subordinate women to men and makes it difficult for women to assert their sexual and reproductive health rights. In the study, the author develops a Multi-level Approach to Strengthen, Protect, and Promote Sexual and Reproductive Rights of Women to guarantee women's enjoyment of their sexual and reproductive health rights. During her Ph.D. journey, Leah has also published ten articles in DHET accredited journals whilst the thesis, itself, has the potential to generate five manuscripts, one of which has already been published while four others under review.

#### CITATION

The thesis interrogates the construction of the self and the nation through a textual analysis of South African and Zimbabwean selected women auto/biographies. Smith and Watson's (2001) interpretation that auto/biography is self-life writing which is porous in nature, accommodates various narratives, was adopted as a handle for the basis of analysis. Through an in-depth interrogation of autobiographical, postcolonial, womanist and feminist theories, the study explored how auto/biographies enable the recovery of women's voices silenced by history and the specific forms of identities of selves and nation-hoods that they depict. The study supports the notion that the self emerges from its gendered private space into the public domain, inadvertently transforms autobiography to protest writing, as well as a political project. It focused on the African patriarchal society and called for its modernization so that women can take their proper place in it. The study concludes that it is not possible to deploy a singular self to tell one's story but rather to include the lived experiences of others differently positioned to provide a holistic view of the predicaments and prevailing situation of a society. It further determines that nationalism is a gendered discourse and that violence against women and resistance are shaped by specific cultural contexts and ideological forces. In addition, an invaluable contribution to critical scholarship that seeks to understand how authors frame various issues affecting women and how their experiences have impacted the positive social and political development of Southern African communities, is made by this study.

: Exploring vocabulary teaching competencies of Grade 10 English First Additional Language teachers of Thohoyandou Cluster in Vhembe East District

#### CITATION:

The study explores the vocabulary teaching competencies of Grade 10 English FAL teachers of Thohoyandou Cluster in Vhembe East District. It is pedestalled in Shulman's Pedagogical Content Knowledge and Vygotsky's Sociocultural theories, while being anchored on the parallel-convergent research design. Nndwamato used the pragmatism paradigm to understand the vocabulary teaching dynamics used by the 50 sampled English teachers in their classrooms. Even though the teachers were found to be aware of CAPS expectations and were armed with satisfactory mastery of the English language, the findings confirm that Grade 10 English FAL teachers' vocabulary teaching competencies are inadequate. The study, therefore, proposes that there should be regular INSET to keep teachers abreast with current vocabulary teaching practices. Alternate vocabulary teaching strategies were recommended to augment the vocabulary teaching competences of the teachers.

#### TSHAMANO HUMBULANI SIMSON

Title : The Untold Stories of Women Farmers' Experiences, with Special Reference to their Socio-economic Conditions: A Case of Nwanedi Farms in the Vhembe District, Limpopo Province, South Africa, 1994-2013

#### CITATION

The thesis examines the experiences of rural women who ventured into commercial farming in the area of Nwanedi. Their journey started after 1994 due to the land claims in the area of Nwanedi. The development unsettled white farmers who immediately vacated the area, allowing aspiring black farmers, women included, to move in and established themselves. Three local chiefs lodged their claims on the area and due to the shortage of men, thanks to the migrant labour system, they ended up allocating the land to aspiring women farmers. Selection relied on women's experiences, gained on white farms and or as subsistence farmers on the land allocated to their husbands according to customary law. These women took into farming despite the constraints of the patriarchal nature of their society shaped by both customary and Roman-Dutch laws that often made it difficult for women to obtain title to land. By drawing on feminist theories that view patriarchy as the primary source of women's oppression, Mr. Tshamano put women at the centre by telling a unique story that has remained largely on the margins of academic scholarship. This study has afforded rural women farmers the opportunity to reconstruct their own past by bringing the pre-colonial, colonial and post-colonial situation regarding the status of African women. The study collected and analysed raw data from women farmers themselves, hence the utilization of unexplored data from whose analysis together with the blending of theoretical perspectives to add on to the existing knowledge in the field. The study utilized qualitative research methodology with in-depth interviews method to capture the original voices of the women farmers, regarding their lived experiences of farming. Mr. Tshamano, therefore discovered that, Nwanedi women farmers are finding it difficult to secure land due to the challenges brought about by both customary and Roman-Dutch laws. This can only be remedied by revisiting land tenure and made it gender sensitive.

#### DOCTOR OF ADMINISTRATION SETHU MAHLODI JOYCE

Title : The Role of Performance, Monitoring and Evaluation on Municipal Service Delivery: A Case Study of Capricon District Municipality, Limpopo Province.

#### CITATION:

This study is about the role of performance, monitoring and evaluation on municipal service delivery in the Capricorn District Municipality, Limpopo Province. The performance, monitoring and evaluation (PM&E) is used by the Department of Performance, Monitoring and Evaluation (DPME) to track service delivery progress by local government. The PM&E was introduced by Cabinet in 2011, through the GWM&E policy framework. which is applicable to all spheres of government. The focus was on whether the introduction of GWM&E as a policy framework contributes towards the improvement of PM&E, on local government. The implementation of PM&E has put enormous pressure, on municipalities, to improve service delivery. There are challenges with PM&E, in and around CDM that impact adversely on service delivery. These include lack of leadership commitment in implementing basic financial and performance management (attributable to the ineffectiveness of PM&E within municipalities), lack of staff capacity on PM&E committees; shortage of and poor infrastructural services, and an increase in service delivery protests within municipalities as a result of poor or lack of basic services to communities. The National Treasury (2018), states that changes in both the internal and external business environments are approached through PM&E. This is one critical area requiring continuous intervention within local government due to key challenges. PM&E has in the recent years become a necessary requirement for programmes/projects, therefore, this study required ways of assisting CDM to improve on service delivery through effective role of PM&E on municipal service delivery.

Title

: Post-Settlement Challenges on Land Restitution Beneficiaries in the Vhembe District Municipality Area.

#### CITATION:

This thesis was conducted within the subject area of policy implementation in Public Management. The study investigated the post-settlement challenges faced by land restitution beneficiaries in the Vhembe District Municipality area. A sociological paradigm was used with a compliment of normative administration tenants within Public Administration to establish the state of challenges faced by land restitution beneficiaries towards sustainable development around Vhembe District. A sample drawn from the selected parts of community associations that took responsibility of land transferred to claimants has provided and data that was thematical collated through a Statistical Package of the Social Sciences (SPSS). Drawing from the existing literature and interpretation of the empirical data extracted, it has been revealed that there is vast inappropriate policy planning that accompany land restitution to assist beneficiaries to sustain the economic viability of the claimed land.

Analysis confirm that such has an impact on sustainable economic development in such communities. The findings reveal that communities that there is lack of continuous support to communities that have beneficiated the land restitution process and that eventually render the policy ideal to collapse. The study further revealed that there is an evident existence of inappropriate planning and lack of post-settlement support which impact negatively on sustainable economic development of the land restitution beneficiaries.

Title: Demographic and Personality Factors Predicting Leadership Style and<br/>Coping Strategies of Working Women in the Public Sector: A Case of<br/>Vhembe District in Limpopo Province

#### CITATION:

This thesis was conducted within the subject area of leadership in Human Resource Management. The study investigated the influence of personality factors on leadership styles among women in positions of power in the Vhembe District area. A quantitative research design was used to collect the data around Vhembe District. A simple random and purposive techniques were used to drawn participants from the selected women in leadership positions in public sector of Vhembe District area. Statistical Package of the Social Sciences (SPSS) was used in analysing data, were descriptive and inferential statistics were used. The study findings showed that indeed there is a significant positive relationship between personality, leadership style and coping strategies. Furthermore, women in leadership in various public organizations in Vhembe District, their personalities are not affected by their age or work experience and marital status. In comparison, there is a positive relationship between leadership style and coping strategies, work experience and age. The stepwise multiple regression analysis results indicated that that extraversion was the most important negative predictor of transformational, transactional, and laissez-faire leadership style. The study further revealed that conscientiousness was the most important predictor of engagement coping strategy and openness to experience was the most important predictor of disengagement coping strategy. The study contributes to both the discipline and practice. The study demonstrates the unique interaction of the constructs on women's leadership style and coping mechanisms in the public-sector workplace. It will add value to HRM policies and strategies development, in terms of coping and leadership for women in leadership in public sector. The government legislative will benefit from this study when reviewing gender equality and women empowerment. Two conceptual articles are due for editorial consideration have been generated from the thesis.

The study investigated the state of IT governance (ITG) in a higher education institution (HEI). Several ITG studies conducted in the past showed that there are still ITG challenges in HEIs. The study developed VIVHO model to mitigate such challenges. The model will guide the implementation of ITG in HEIs. The VIVHO model ensures that the provisions of the ICT strategy are aligned to those of the organisational strategy. The name of the model is VIVHO ITG Model. VIVHO is an acronym that summarises the key ITG concepts: Vision- Council is responsible for strategic envisioning; Intelligence (i.e. Planning) which is a role played by management to ensure that the organisation responds and adapts to the environmental changes; Value delivery to ensure that the organisation gets value from the implementation of ICT; Holistic view which encourages ITG practitioners to look at the big picture of the whole ITG environment & **Oversight** which ensures effective monitoring and evaluation of ICT projects in HEIs. VHIVHO also ensures the active participation of the Chief Information Officer (CIO) and stakeholders during the development and implementation of the organisational strategy and of the ICT strategy, respectively. It also clarifies the roles of different structures in the ITG of HEIs. The benefits in the implementation of VIVHO ITG Model are effective and efficient use of ICT resources, and enhancement of the quality of service.
