Feenix is committed to student success through monitoring, learning, and responding to student needs.

At the time this report was developed, 1435 students had registered on Feenix's crowdfunding platform for the 2021 academic year to seek funding support toward their educational journeys.

Since last year's report, there has been a slight overall improvement in student success indicators, or thrive drivers, measured by this self-reported student survey from 295 respondents.

Two new notable contributing factors were delivered in direct response to students' emerging needs in 2020:

- 1. The Feenix's student webinar series was ranked by students as the second most helpful Feenix service in support of their success
- 2. Access to the Blackbullion South Africa financial literacy platform increased a sense of financial stability by 25% for users vs non-users.

This report once again highlights the resource challenges of students and how the efforts of Feenix's multiple stakeholders and services help to overcome these challenges.

We sincerely thank all stakeholders for their generous contribution in easing the stress and anxiety that accompanies financial and environmental pressures influencing the daily lives of students who have chosen to remain resilient and committed to the future of our nation.





FEENIX'S ALIGNMENT TO NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL **DEVELOPMENT AGENDAS**



The National Development Plan highlights an urgent need for more postgraduate studies to boost the knowledge economy and improve educational outcomes at all levels.

Postgraduate students however do not qualify to receive funds through the National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS).

33% of all students on Feenix are seekings funds for their postgraduate studies.



SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS (SDG)

Feenix plays an important part in allowing equal access to education as envisioned by SDG 4.3: to ensure equal access for all women and men to affordable and quality technical, vocational and tertiary education, including university.

This report indicates low affordability

and low accessibility of students to funding for their degrees.

Besides crowdfunding, Feenix mobilises bursaries for previously disadvantaged individuals through the management of companies' BBBEE Skills Development Investments.









It is important to understand why students arrive at Feenix. Creating a public fundraising profile can feel quite vulnerable, yet for the majority of students on Feenix, it provides them with hope! Crowdfunding for one's education indicates the inability to afford higher education and being financially excluded from existing funding mechanisms such as student loans, scholarships or bursaries, and public education funding. Let's see why so many students arrive at Feenix to tell their stories with a need to take ownership of their education resourcing.

WHAT WERE STUDENTS' FUNDING OPTIONS?



83% of students don't qualify for NSFAS. Why?



- Postgraduate studies (majority)
- Exceeded the years of funding allowed
- Fundraising for historical debt
- Degree type does not qualify
- Second degrees aren't funded

17% of students qualify for NSFAS, but still choose Feenix. Why?



- NSFAS doesn't cover all the fees (majority)
- Students hadn't heard back yet and created a Feenix profile as a back up
- Other (not receiving funds for various reasons, some unknown)

GO LIVE

Feenix offers equal, unbiased access to its platform to students who:

- are South African or hold refugee status,
- are registered at one of its 26 public universities,
- have a combined household income of below R600,000 per annum.

This process requires moderation in order to ensure that the platform serves deserving young people and that companies can confidently invest in local talent. This section provides a statistical snapshot of who these students are.



LIVE ON FEENIX AS AT OCT 2021



Since 2017, Feenix has raised **R85.62m**, impacting the lives of 2156 students across 26 universities. 1435 students were live on Feenix as at Oct 2021.

FEENIX SUPPORTS STUDENT SUCCESS

Once students have a live profile, they have access to multiple Feenix features and services. These have been rated by students for their contribution to student success as follows:



#1 Creating a profile on Feenix which helped to reduce stress and anxiety, and provide hope

"My public profile on Feenix makes people aware of who I am and my story. This draws them into my personal life".

#2 Attending Webinars

"The webinars provided motivation and a real life experience of students who went through more or less similar challenges I was facing. Providing me with a positive attitude toward my fundraising journey and supporting every little step I took".



#3 Receiving donations

"Receiving donations has really got me closer and closer to settling my financial obligations and gave me the power and hope to continue raising money".



#4 Access to Feenix fundraising guides and tools

"The guides and tools take away the stress of having to put yourself out there, by putting forward clear and useful information that can benefit all students wishing to use Feenix."



#5 Taking part in Blackbullion Financial Literacy platform

"Taking part in the Blackbullion financial literacy platform has proven to be the biggest take of this whole Feenix journey. I have learnt a lot, I am money smart, I think twice and even three times about anything that has to do with money, and I have started imparting some of the skills even at home. I've been helping my mother with drafting the monthly budget, looking at ways we can have some extra cash by cutting on a few things. It's so much fun".

SURVIVE

For students who are financially excluded, there are numerous other socio-economic and environmental factors that challenge students' ability to get to their goal post. We explore what the typical student on Feenix has to overcome to survive their educational journeys. By understanding these additional challenges, we can shape an understanding of why academic **excellence** is not a prerequisite for students to receive funding through Feenix. It is why Feenix recognises academic progression as a sign of resilience and determination and offers additional, holistic support in response to identified challenges where possible.



STUDENTS & CHALLENGES

CHALLENGES STUDENTS HAD TO OVERCOME

Besides students' #1 challenge of funding, these two challenges were felt the most:



Online / remote learning



Noteworthy: Compared to 2020, students are increasingly expressing feelings of anxiety, stress or worries affecting their mental health.

Positive effects of remote learning

- Students enjoyed the flexibility to study in their own time and be more independent although, in practice, students report time management as a major challenge.
- Students expressed gaining technical and digital skills they didn't have before.
- Students were able to save on some expense items by being at home and were able to support their families more closely.

STUDENTS & RESILIENCE

ARE STUDENTS ON TRACK TO COMPLETE THEIR DEGREES?





Only 2 students **dropped out** while 7 students (2%) were financially excluded and/or couldn't access their results.

WHAT DOES THE FUTURE OF WORK LOOK LIKE?

20% of current students have employment opportunities lined up for when they graduate, while 52% are actively trying to find opportunities.

2020 GRADUATES

52 GRADUATED STUDENTS GAVE US SOME INSIGHT INTO THEIR SURVIVAL AFTER GRADUATION:



96% students who graduated last year are staying in South Africa.



50% of the students who graduated from their 2020 degrees are earning an income, and 50% of those earning are doing so in their field of study.



69% of these graduates still have outstanding debt, which influences their chances of employability.



The highest number of earners are from Commerce/Management Science (38%), followed by Humanities (17%) and Science & Engineering (13%).

THRIVE

We're a nation investing in students to complete their degrees and become positively contributing citizens of this country. With every donation, student stress is chipped away and their hope grows. With direct support from the Feenix student team and student ambassadors, students feel more emotionally supported. Access to financial literacy provides a renewed sense of financial stability. Attending Feenix webinars shows students that they are not alone in their journeys. This is how Feenix hopes to support students to not just survive but to thrive.

EMOTIONAL SUPPORT

FINANCIAL STABILITY

Feenix signed up to the Blackbullion Financial Education platform. Its active users rated 25% higher on financial stability than non-users.





ACADEMIC PROGRESS



Definition: not academic excellence but one's ability to progress in their studies.

Students felt webinars were most useful by motivating them to persevere.
