



### Vice Chancellor and Principal Read inside declares the 2023 academic vear officially open



The Vice-Chancellor and Principal of the University of Venda, Dr Bernard Nthambeleni officially opened the 2023 academic year in an event that took place on Monday, 06 February 2023 in the University Auditorium. "Your academic journey has just begun, the progress of completing your studies and courses you have chosen would largely depend on how you conduct yourself. Always remember that the prize of success is hard work and dedication," these were the words by the Vice-Chancellor and Principal, Dr Bernard Nthambeleni as he welcomed the first entering students. The official opening ceremony marked the commencement of the 2023 academic year of the University.



Dr Nthambeleni further told new students that success in life does not come easy. "All your dreams can come true if you have the courage to pursue them. You have now become the sole author of the next chapters of your story. You have the opportunity to determine the direction and the pace at which your story should go." He encouraged first year students to yow to themselves that they will complete their studies within the

minimum stipulated time for their respective degrees because most of them have passed matric with good grades. "We expect you to do very well in your chosen fields of study."

Dr Nthambeleni told students and staff to make UNIVEN proud through their contributions, especially by being hard working, innovative, and ethical in their conduct.

He welcomed UNIVEN class of 2023 and recognised the 2022/2023 SRC leadership. "I am particularly impressed with the calibre of the young men and women who represent you in the SRC." He cited that the UNIVEN SRC leadership has demonstrated a satisfactory level of understanding and maturity in handling difficult issues and dealing with serious challenges facing the higher education system. "As University management, we are committed to work with the SRC and University staff in general to create a conducive environment for teaching and learning."

In his official opening address, he also expressed his appreciation to academic staff members and all-support staff who are ready to make 2023 a successful year for UNIVEN.

The Vice-Chancellor and Principal outlined how the students and staff can make meaningful contributions toward the implementation of the 2021-2025 Strategic Plan. As he talked about the UNIVEN Strategic Plan 2021-2025 he said "In line with our motto of "Creating Future leaders," we want to educate and produce leaders who not only have a command of the core knowledge in their chosen academic disciplines but who also possess the qualities needed to succeed in an increasingly socially, culturally, and technologically interconnected, complex world".

In addition, Dr Nthambeleni indicated that the University identified four (4) strategic thrusts to guide its direction for the next five (5) years with the focus on Student Centeredness and Engaged Scholarship; Entrepreneurial University; Attention to our governance frameworks to ensure outstanding Scholarship and Linkages, Partnerships, and Internationalisation.

He advised students to resist patriarchal ideologies that view and treat women as inferior to men and perpetuate violence against women and children. "As an institution of higher learning, we must lead in this fight of eradicating gender-based violence and embrace diversity in our campus," said Dr Nthambeleni.

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Dr Nthambeleni told the students at the University that they are always expected to live and uphold and adhere to the University values. He further advised first entering students in particular, to avoid drugs and alcohol abuse.

He continued to advise students to abide by the core values and guiding principles that the University subscribes to. He said, "We are driven by the following sets of values: We believe in Quality and Excellence, Accountability, Transparency, Integrity, Respect, Diversity, Social Responsibility and Community Engagement and lastly Ubuntu."

The Vice-Chancellor and Principal informed the audience that the University has taken a decision that all first-year students will be expected to do a compulsory online Entrepreneurship course in partnership with Technological Higher Education Network South Africa and all our final year and Honours students will be required to do a compulsory Artificial Intelligence course partnering with the University of Johannesburg. Students will receive certificates upon completion at no cost to them.

"Our University should not only lead in research output but must provide relevant solutions that will contribute to South Africa's development priorities, especially employment creation, poverty alleviation, food security, redress and development, nation building and promotion of human rights culture."

The Vice-Chancellor and Principal pointed that the University of Venda is a well-managed institution of higher learning and for the past five years the University continued to achieve unqualified audit reports by the Auditor General South Africa.

When it comes to the Improved Facilities and Student Housing, Dr Nthambeleni reported that the University is nearing completion of facilities designed to cater for the needs of students living with disabilities.

During the ceremony, Dr Nthambeleni also handed over awards to students with outstanding performance from the Faculty of Science, Engineering and Agriculture, Faculty of Management, Commerce and Law, Faculty of Humanities, Social Sciences and Education and Faculty of Health Sciences as part of the Vice-Chancellor's Student Academic Excellence Awards.

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Director of Centre for Higher Education Teaching and Learning (CHETL) Dr Lindiwe Mulaudzi gave the background of the Vice-Chancellor's Student Academic Excellence Awards. In her brief talk, she said that another significance is the awarding of Vice Chancellor's Student Academic Excellence Awards and we do this with great excitement since for the past two years, we have not been able to award best students due to the compulsory Covid-19 hiatus. The following are awards categories: Foundation, First year, Second- and Third-year students. In terms of prizes, Foundation and First year receive an amount of R8000, 2nd year: R9000.00 and 3rd year: R10 000.00, 20% of the award is in cash while 80% is in kind and the awardee may choose from items such as tuition fees, book, accommodation etc. A trophy is awarded to the best overall student at each level and to the best overall performer.

Ms C Maravanyika, a Second-Year student in the Faculty of Management, Commerce and Law was announced as the best overall student performer of the Vice-Chancellor's Student Academic Excellence awards 2023. She received her award in absentia.

The main reason for the awards is to promote the culture of teaching and learning in all faculties. The awards are a recognition of hard work by both students and lecturers. They are given at the beginning of the academic year to honour students' outstanding performance of the previous year and to motivate all students to aim for the stars.



To conclude the official opening of the Academic year 2023 the University Registrar, Advocate Edward Lambani congratulated first entering students for passing their matric and managing to register for the programmes of their choice at UNIVEN. He said, "You are authors of your success stories, your behaviour, your lifestyle and conduct will determine your future."

He stated that the event was a success and acknowledged the sponsorship received from Mr Andries Ndlovu, from Standard Bank.

### NRF-Ratings for two staff members from the Faculty of Science, Engineering and Agriculture

Two University of Venda (UNIVEN) staff members in the Faculty of Science, Engineering and Agriculture, Prof Milingoni Peter Tshisikhawe and Dr Lawrence Diko-Makia received new NFF Ratings. Dr Lawrence Diko-Makia is now a C2 NFF Rated Researcher while Prof Milingoni Peter Tshisikhawe is a C3 NFF Rated Researcher with effect from 01 January 2023.

Prior to the re-evaluation, Dr Lawrence Diko-Makia held a Y2 rating (2017 - 2022). He is currently a Senior Lecturer in the Department of Earth Sciences. He holds a PhD in Geology

(from UL - South Africa), an MSc in Applied Geology and BSc (Hons) in Geology and Environmental Science from the University of Buea, Cameroon. His research interests include Applied Clay Science, Environmental and Medical Geology, with current focus on clays and clay minerals, geohealth and georesource-climate change interactions for sustainable development. He is a recipient of several fellowships and awards such as; PhD scholarship courtesy of UNESCO/IUGS/IGCP 545 Project on Clays and Clay Minerals in Africa, Cambridge Certificate for Outstanding Scientific Achievement 2013, and Vice Chancellor's Award for Best Researcher in the School of Physical and Mineral Sciences, University of Limpopo, 2016. Dr Diko Makia was a nominee for the NSTF-South 32 Awards 2021/2022 in three categories (TW Kambule-NSTF Award: Researcher, Innovation Award: Corporate Organisation; and the Special Annual Theme Award: Application of basic sciences for sustainable development). His nomination was based on contribution to science and innovation in the area of clay and clay minerals valorization for industrial and geomedicinal application. His application for registration of a patent is currently under consideration. Lawrence is a member of several professional bodies, notably the International Medical Geology Association (IMGA), Geological Society of America (GSA), the Geological Society of South Africa (GSSA) and the African Clavs and Clay Minerals Research Group. He is the head, and co-founder of the Soil, Water and Climate Extremes (SWACE) Research Group, which prides itself on an expanding network of national and international researchers and partner organisations. Dr Diko-Makia has an impressive publication record and is also actively involved with postgraduate student supervision and mentorship.

Prof Milingoni Peter Tshisikhawe is an Associate Professor and Interim Head of

the Department of Biological Sciences in the Faculty of Science, Engineering and Agriculture. He completed his junior degree to Master of Science in Botany at the University of Venda. He graduated with his PhD in Plant Science at the University of Pretoria and his Postgraduate Diploma in Higher Education with Rhodes University. Prof Tshisikhawe is a plant ecologist whose research interest is centered around indigenous plant use and their sustainability thereof. He is a researcher who has graduated several postgraduate students (Masters and PhDs) and published extensively in accredited peer-reviewed journals of plant science. He had mentored postdoctoral and junior staff members over

# Professors Modimowabarwa Kanyane and Mzo Sirayi receive the Star of Discovery Award by WHITRAP under the auspices of UNESCO

In response to the call "World Heritage Education for the Future" made by the World Heritage Institute of Training and Research for Asia and the Pacific (WHITRAP) region under the auspices of UNESCO, a total of 30 cases were selected for the awards from nearly 100 cases worldwide. Professor Modimowabarwa Kanyane, Executive Dean of the Faculty of Management, Commerce and Law and Professor Mzo Sirayi UNIVEN Adjunct Professor made the University proud as the winners of the Star of Discovery Award for their case: "Smart Village Through Indigenous Knowledge and Fourth Industrial Revolution in South Africa." Ms LOU Ya, Partnership Officer of the UN Resident Coordinator's Office in China, announced the 10 winning cases of Star of Discovery in the 2022 "Global Awards for World Heritage Education Innovative Cases". The case emerged from their smart village project funded by the DSI. While there are rural push and urban pull factors linked to movements from rural to urban

areas, a smart village is necessary, used as a catalyst to reverse the movement for job creation and prosperity to enhance country life in rural areas through IKS and the 4iR binaries.

a key activity recommended by UNESCO to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the World Heritage Convention, the 2022 "Global Awards for World Heritage Education Innovative Cases" International Sharing Forum was held in December 2022 to announce the awards. The Forum was presided over by LI Xin, Deputy Secretary-General (WHITRAP). Nearly 50 representatives of international institutions, award winners, cooperative partners, and an expert panel from all over the world attended the Forum online. An audience of 8,008 also joined the Forum via live streaming. All winning cases will automatically enter into related cooperation networks and will be given priority to participate in relevant international cooperation and innovative pilot projects. The list of the Global Awards and relevant events will be published on UNESCO's websites worldwide.

Prof Crafford further advised the first entering students to strive to empower themselves academically, economically, and personally, more so to believe in themselves. He appealed to students to have faith in themselves and become entrepreneurs before they even finished their degrees. He concluded his official opening message by saying "You are the hope of our better future and for our country at large."



UNIVEN SRC President, Mr Gudani Tshamano took the opportunity and congratulated all first entering students who got spaces at the University of Venda. He indicated that we are indeed honoured by the fact that out of all 26 universities, you chose the University Venda, which simply means that there is something special about it. Mr Tshamano stated that the SRC makes sure that first entering

students register for free because UNIVEN understands the struggle of people. As the SRC President, Mr Tshamano mentioned that students register for free because education is not a commodity to be sold, education is a birth right. "The moment you are born you have the right to education", says Tshamano, UNIVEN SRC President.

In his closing remarks, Adv Edward Lambani, University Registrar encouraged the new students to make use of the opportunities that UNIVEN offers to become successful. The University of Venda delegation of honours, masters, and PhD students participated in posters and oral presentations under different themes. Takalani's topic was presented under an ethnobotany session with the title: 'The quantitative survey of medicinal plants found in the home gardens of Vhavenda residing in Vuwani Area, Vhembe District, Limpopo Province, South Africa'.

## Making a difference - Community engagement is critically needed



Prof Angelina Maphula is attached to the Faculty of Health Sciences in the Department of Psychology at the University of Venda. She is a qualified Clinical Psychologist who is passionate about young people.

2022 was a year when Prof Maphula identified a dire need for impactful engagement with young people, given the various social issues that continue to paralyse their goals. It is essential to note that young people are more susceptible to challenges because of their developmental stage, although, currently, on one hand, knowledge in social media has advantages in many ways, on the other hand, it also amplifies young people's problems. Prof Angelina Mapula highlighted that young people go through depression, anxiety, bullying, drug abuse, alcohol abuse, witness domestic violence, teenage pregnancy, peer pressure and academic problems, just to mention a few. Many come from dysfunctional families where no one is a role model, which often compromises prospects

Prof Maphula started a drive to make a difference. She immersed herself in schools around Vhembe District in an effort to encourage young people to focus on their studies, despite the challenges they continue to face. This drive was aimed at improving their psychological well-being (health

benefit) and resilience by reviving their sense of purpose when it comes to education as well as social responsibilities.

Visiting schools in 2022 was beneficial for many young people who confessed that they would want to do better than they are doing now. Prof Maphula managed to visit the following schools: Mugoidwa, Lwandani, Edson Nesengani, Lwamondo, Nndamuleleni, Dimani, Shayandima, Mukhwantheli, Kolokoshani and Ndaedzo Secondary School, Tshiwedza, Rasivhetshele, Avhatondwi Primary School; and Hilmary Child Centre for their graduation.

During the 2022 drive, Prof Maphula observed the following:

- Each time she visited a school, there will be parents in the principal's office, resolving a problem (either the learner did not obey certain protocols, bullying, or misconduct of one kind or another).
- In every school it was reported that there are learners who are consuming alcohol, using drugs which are detrimental to their health, as well as disruptive to their academic progress, and the smooth running of the school.
- Teachers confessed that learners are more focused on intimate relationships than schoolwork hence, learners are often fighting for boyfriends and/or girlfriends.
- It was also reported that some learners come from extremely poor families and its impact interferes mostly with their health leading to deteriorating progress.
- Teachers also indicated that they are mostly solving problems from dysfunctional families, who offer little support to their children, causing them extreme amounts of stress and suffering.

The message that came strongly was that young people in rural areas need to be engaged constructively for attitude change.

It is crucial to communicate the message that being born in rural areas does not nullify learners' capacity to thrive and becoming a success story. Our young people yearn for a positive word from someone they can look up to, who would acknowledge the potential to achieve their goals. To curb the high rates of - teenage pregnancy, drug and alcohol abuse, depression and low academic performance, young people must conceive a new message to invest their energies into positive tasks instead of destructive behaviours. In addition, Prof Maphula also reached out to Ha-Mangilasi community where she spoke to girls about "Protecting

one's dream and quality decision that influences success;" she was also requested multiple times to provide expert opinion on Phalaphala FM, UNIVEN Radio, Vhembe FM and Capricorn FM addressing "Mental Health Issues."

In conclusion, it is important to indicate that making a difference might not come easy, but if as a nation, we stand together and work in our communities, surely change will occur. Prof Maphula, thus, is encouraging everyone to play a part in making a difference; influence some to keep them away from unhealthy habits and influence others to fight against feelings of helplessness.

### UNIVEN presents its state of readiness to the Parliamentary Portfolio Committee on Higher Education, Science, and Innovation



On Wednesday, 01 February 2023, the University of Venda (UNIVEN), hosted the Parliamentary Portfolio Committee on Higher Education, Science, and Innovation led by its Chairperson, Honourable Nompendulo Mkhatshwa.
