Adv Gumbi confers 2666 certificates. diplomas, and degrees during **Autumn Graduation Ceremonies**



UNIVEN Chancellor, Adv Mojanku Gumbi conferred a total of 2,666 certificates, diplomas, and degrees during the graduation ceremonies which took place over four days in seven sessions. The graduation ceremonies took place from 14 to 17 May 2024. Out of the total number of 2666 araduates, 38 were the PhDs who graduated only in this Autumn graduation.

In her congratulatory address, UNIVEN Chancellor, Adv Mojanku Gumbi apologised to graduates on behalf of her generation for not making this country one of the best in the past 30 years. In 1994 the country was pregnant with hope. Unfortunately, along the way, some people became greedy, some became liars while others became thieves. She told graduates that it is unfortunate that the country that they are going to walk into is not a country that South Africans have hoped for. She said UNIVEN is trying to fix the things that her generation could not achieve in the past 30 years. When talking about the shoes that she has donated, Advocate Gumbi mentioned that this donation is not just a gesture of ubuntu and the celebration of 30 years of democracy, it is also because she wanted to show graduates that there is hope. The hope of entrepreneurship. The hope for graduates to create jobs for many unemployed people. She said a young man and a woman from Free State Province decided to manufacture Modern Mbadada shoes. "One woman from Mpumalanga Province crafted the shoes called Mama Kea and the last one being a young Black man from Limpopo who designed Bathu." Adv Gumbi said these young people saw that the country is faced with challenges of unemployment and decided to create opportunities for themselves and employed others. She said she is doing this because this University is trying to channel graduates into the entrepreneurship space. "We can get this country revived in the next 30 years. Once in your lifetime, you need to stand for something irrespective of challenges. Let us do the right things for once. Make sure that the next 30 years are better than the previous 30 years of democracy. When you walk out here (referring to the graduation hall), tell

yourself that you are going to do better than my generation." She congratulated graduates, parents and guardians and advised them to go and cast their votes on 29 of May.

"Education is the passport to the future, for tomorrow belongs to those who prepare for it." Those are the words of Malcolm X echoed by the Vice-Chancellor and Principal, Prof Bernard Nthambeleni acknowledging that it might had been a long and exhausting, but certainly a rewarding journey for graduands. Prof Nthambeleni echoed these words during the University's 2024 Autumn Graduation ceremonies.



He took a moment and expressed heartfelt condolences to Mokgoro's family for the loss of Justice Yvonne Mokgoro who passed away on Thursday, 9 May 2024. Prof Nthambeleni described Justice Mokgoro as a symbol of selfless humanity, someone with a natural nobility who was classless. He said during her tenure as the UNIVEN Chairperson of Council. she refused to claim her sitting allowance paid to Council members. Instead. all her sitting allowances were channeled towards the award for best performing students.

Prof Nthambeleni paid tribute to Justice

"This is one of the occasions that provides us with an opportunity to report back to the custodians of the University - the parents and community at large," he said.

Prof Nthambeleni continued to report to the parents, graduands and the community at large that the success of a University is measured by the standing of its academics, researchers, and the quality of its outputs, inter alia graduates and the research it produces. He said there is a direct correlation between the quality of the staff and the quality of the outputs. In other words, you cannot expect to produce good research outputs and quality graduates if your staff is below par.

In the new rankings report of Times Higher Education for 2024 that was released on Tuesday, 14 May 2024, the UNIVEN has performed very well in the new ranking category of South African universities at the age of 50 and below. UNIVEN has been ranked number four, number one being UJ, UKZN, NW, UNIVEN and DUT."

He mentioned that in the same report of Times Higher Education, the UNIVEN has also improved its global/world ranking and is now in the top 300 universities in 2024 moving from top 400 in 2023.

"All of this is happening because we have invested a lot in promoting and encouraging our staff to further their studies and acquire higher degrees. This investment is paying off as we are witnessing an increase in the number of permanent staff with PhDs. The quality of our academic and research staff is also evident in the increase in the number of our rated researchers, which has grown exponentially from only 12 in 2012 to 46 in 2024. It is precisely because of this quality that our University is gaining recognition nationally and internationally for its rigor and scholarly outputs." When speaking about the Best Performing Student Awards, Prof Nthambeleni highlighted that UNIVEN strives to produce graduates that are locally relevant and globally competitive and to effectively achieve this mission, this University needs partners from different industries and business entities

He expressed his profound appreciation to all donors and sponsors for sponsoring awards to UNIVEN's best performing students. Prof Nthambeleni further appreciated the support that UNIVEN has received from Forever Resorts South Africa. Two weeks before graduation week, he signed a Memorandum of Agreement with Forever Resorts South Africa and through this partnership, ten graduates with BCom Tourism and Hospitality Management will be placed at different resorts throughout the country for a period of 12 months.

The University of Venda through the Gordon Institute of Business Science (GIBS), University of Pretoria, undertook a training for its Senior managers on Leadership Development programme that aims to ensure that there is proper capacity building for employees to safeguard a seamless process of succession management. The leadership and management development programmes were developed in collaboration with various institutions that are already in the space of leadership, management, and executive management development programmes.

The programme came to conclusion through the handing over of certificates, graduation that took place at GIBS Campus in Johannesburg on Wednesday, 22 May 2024.

The University of Venda (UNIVEN) Registrar, Dr Joel Baloyi as the keynote speaker during the graduation ceremony at GIBS campus elaborated on the phrase "Non scholae sed vitae discimus" which translates to - "we learn for life and not for the classroom," a phrase that emphasises practical education rather than just mastering literature.

Leadership education should focus on preparing leaders to tackle the complex scenarios faced by society and organisations in today's VUCA and BANI worlds. The University Registrar underscores that leaders must have vision, understanding, clarity, and agility, as well as the ability to think in different boxes simultaneously and generate integrated solutions that impact present problems and consider long-term sustainability. He mentioned that this requires agile thinking, decision-making, strong teams, integrated thinking, and value alignment.

Dr Baloyi maintained that traditional problem-solving paradigms, such as design thinking and systems thinking, are no longer sufficient. He indicated that universities must also address issues related to access to higher education, such as academic exclusion, student financial aid, quality assurance, regulatory requirements, and good governance. He cited that the Gordon Institute of Business Science, a world-class business school, is a prime example of a world-class institution that has a strong reputation for excellence.

Dr Takalani Dzaga, Director Marketing, Branding and Communication shared the leadership development programme journey from the participant's perspective, emphasising the importance of a human-centered approach, fostering a culture of learning, and promoting ethical conduct. He highlighted the distinction between leading and managing people, accenting the importance of emotional intelligence, delegating responsibilities, and ensuring psychological safety.

He said the training also highlighted the importance of being positive, communicating for impact, and conducting performance reviews more frequently. Dr Dzaga also spoke about the design thinking principles, encouraging colleagues to follow acceptable standards to solve complex problems. Collaboration also emphasised. was particularly the promotion of collaboration rather than competition. He stressed that the value of the investment in the training would soon be realised and committed to the University Executive Management to ensure the successful implementation of the University Strategy, using the skills acquired through the training.

A talented Univen Physics Master student from the Faculty of Science, Engineering and Agriculture selected to attend the prestigious 2024 Lindau Nobel Laureate Meeting in Germany

The Academy of Science of South Africa (ASSAf), as the official partner of the Lindau Foundation and with funding from the Department of Science and Innovation (DSI), nominates young scientists from South Africa annually to attend the Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings. The meetings are a forum for young scientists from around the world to engage in-depth with Nobel Laureates on research and overall career management aspects.

Ms. Letsoalo is one of the eight young scientists from South Africa selected by ASSAF (Academy of Science of South Africa) and the Council for the Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings to participate in the 73rd Lindau Nobel Laureate Meeting dedicated to Physics, which will take place from 30 June to 5 July 2024.

Ms. Modjadji Rebecca Letsoalo is a young woman, from Sebayeng Village around Ga-Dikgale in Polokwane. She obtained a Bachelor of Science in Physical Sciences in the year 2020 and Honours in Physics (cum laude) in the year 2021 from the University of Limpopo. She enrolled for a Master of Science in Physics, at the University of Venda in 2022 focusing on Material sciences (Microsystems technology). She recently submitted her Master thesis and is currently waiting for the results. She's currently a Physics Comment magazine assistant for SAIP (South African Institute of Physics), and a Science communicator at Inkcubeko Youth and Science Center, Bridging the gap between the scientific community and the general public, and promoting a more informed and scientifically literate society.

In her research, Ms. Letsoalo was investigating on Hydrothermal synthesis of nano-scaled pure, Sn, and Zn-doped Co3O4 structures and their gas-sensing applications under the supervision of Dr. Katekani Shingange from MINTEK and Prof. Eric Maluta from the University of Venda. The project aimed to develop nano-enabled Co3O4-based

gas sensors for the detection of various gases in the agriculture and food industry space. The experimental development of the nanomaterials was coupled with theoretical studies through computational calculations for a better understanding of the interaction between target gas molecules and the

Ms. Letsoalo has Won the South African Women in Science Awards (SAWiSA 2023) under the DSI Ndoni Mcunu Masters fellowship category and was 2nd winner for student/Post-doc oral presentation at the 9th South African Conference on Photonic Materials in 2023 at Skukuza rest camp in Mpumalanga for her masters work.

He encouraged students to pursue postgraduate and professional qualifications, such as the PGDA/CTA. SAICA. ACCA, CIMA, SAIGA, and SAIPA. Dr Reynolds told the students that UNIVEN is working on Postgraduate (CTA), ACCA, CIMA, SAIGA and SAIPAaccreditation. He believes that these accreditations will be a game changer for UNIVEN students.

Also present in the event was Mr Peter Munyai, the ABASA Limpopo Representative, 'An Associate of General Accountant South Africa AGA(SA)," and Founder and Managing Director of Zone Incorporation, a firm pecialising in Taxation and Accounting Advisory Services. He awarded prizes to students who answered his questions correctly as a way of motivating them.

He also encouraged students to recruit other students who are in the accounting stream to join ABASA as this could be a better opportunity for students to guarantee traineeships/internships at the end of their studies as ABASA has signed a MoU to

partner with FASSET to provide internships to ABASA members after completion of their undergraduate studies.

Mr Peter Munyai supported Dr Arthur Reynolds's recommendation regarding vocational work opportunities as this could be opportunities for students to create a good impression on their future employers, which might result in a better chance of finding employment at the same company after completing their studies.

He continued to assure the UNIVEN Faculty of Management, Commerce and Law (FMCL) Faculty Chairperson that ABASA not only focuses on advancing black accountants in terms of employment, but it also encourages advancement in black entrepreneurship.

Campus Health Services organises the First Men's Health Conference

The South African National Integrated Men's Health Strategy 2020-2025 is a framework for action to work towards the goal that will ensure that South African men and boys are supported to live a long and healthy life. This strategy aims to deliver a comprehensive and integrated package of care for South African men and boys

It is for this reason that from 21 - 23 May 2024, the University's Campus Health Clinic conducted a Men's Health Awareness Campaign at the School of Law Parking. The purpose of the campaign was to further ensure that men and boys receive treatment, care, and support services for chronic conditions as needed, to build the evidence base for improving men's health and promote healthy lifestyle to the University Community.

During the campaign, screening and testing for different conditions such as blood pressure and blood sugar, cholesterol, TB, STIs, Cancer, HIV, BMI were conducted by Campus Health Clinic staff and Centre for Biokinetics team. Dentists from Tshilidzini Dental Department also rendered their services. The total number of 650, comprising of 155 male students, 95 male staff members and 400 female students accessed these

On the last day of the Campaign, 24 May 2024, the first Men's Health Conference was held at the University Auditorium, promoting a healthy lifestyle. The conference aims to empower and support men and boys to improve their own and each other's health and wellbeing under the theme: 'Build your Tray the Healthy Way and be The Hero Again'. The event was attended by both male university staff and students and was supported by officials from the Department of Health.

In his welcome address, the Acting Head of Campus Health Services, Mr Edward Dongola expressed that every man and boy child should be supported to live a healthy lifestyle. He encouraged men to seek advice when they have challenges and to consult at the nearest health facilities near them when they don't feel well. "With this conference, we wanted to show that the health care facilities are not for females only, they are there for everyone," he said.



In his message of support, the University Registrar, Dr Joel Baloyi said there is a need to remove the societal stereotype and norms of men suffering in silence. He expressed his support for this conference.

stakeholders delivered presentations, advising men on how to live a healthy lifestyle. These stakeholders include Pharmacists - Ms Rhandzu Ndleve, and Mr Johannes Tsati from Tshilidzini Hospital who spoke about drug-to-drug interaction; the Local General Practitioner, Dr Ernest Nangammbi who spoke about Prostate cancer; Prof Pascal Bessong spoke about the causes of Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) while the Dietician from Tshilidzini Hospital, Mr Justice Mugeri spoke under the topic of the only capsule men need. More than 500 male staff and students attended this conference.



The Pharmacists from Tshilidzini Hospital Ms Glory Ndleve and Mr Johannes Tsati, delivered a comprehensive presentation on Drugto-Drug Interaction, covering what drug interaction is, effects of drugs on the liver and who and where to report adverse reaction symptoms (ADRs). During presentation Ms G Ndleve said: "Drug to drug interaction occurs when two or more drugs interact with each other in a way that affects their effectiveness, safety or both. She further said: Modern drugs are being replaced by herbal medicines especially for severe and chronic disease for their fewer side effects, better patient adherence and vast accessibility". In Conclusion they said the following as an alert to the attendees: "Never assume that because herbs or complementary medicines are natural, they are safe. Some herbs may be inappropriate for people with certain medical conditions. Always tell healthcare workers about over-the-counter medications or any herbal medication you are using. Consult/ report immediately if you start to develop some reaction while you are using your medications, herbal, synthetic or both for your safety. Live responsibly for your health for you to have a long-life span".



Dr Ernest Nangammbi gave presentation on Prostate Cancer. In his presentation he delved deep into crucial topics like definition of prostate cancer, sign and symptoms (Waking up frequently at night to urinate, sudden or urgent need to urinate, difficulty starting or stopping urination, weak or interrupted urine flow, unexplained weight loss and lower backache) and risks factors which include old age, race, family history and obesity. He further gave detailed information about Prostate Cancer that, "the second most common disease diagnosed in me, it increases with age; asymptomatic at early age, blacks have the most incidents and have the most aggressive cancer compared to whites. Nearly 1 in 5 men will be diagnosed with the cancer and 5% of those will die of the disease". He concluded his presentation emphasising the importance of annual prostate check-ups since early detection saves life, regular exercises to maintain body weight and healthy lifestyle.



In his presentation Professor and Director SAMRC-UNIVEN Research Unit. Pascal Bessong addressed various aspects on Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR). He also outlined Implications of AMR. He further outlined the Antimicrobial Stewardship (Approaches and procedures for judicious use of antimicrobials; and to mitigate AMR) that includes Commitment, Prevention, Detection, Optimising Use, and Surveillance.



Mr MJ Mugeri, Dietician from Tshilidzini Hospital gave presentation under the topic: "The Only Capsule you want". In his presentation he said that "Health plays an important role in a human being and need to be taken care of daily". He indicated that health is determined by one's daily lifestyle and that alone can also tell if a person will live longer or not.



In his word of acknowledgement, the SRC Minister of Health and Safety, Mr Tsireledzo Munzhedzi thanked UNIVEN for organising this conference. He said this conference has empowered many male staff and students.

UNIVEN academics attended the twoday annual Train-the-Trainer Workshop on Educators for Entrepreneurship

This workshop was organised by the Entrepreneurship Development (EDHE) in partnership with ASHOKA and took place on 08 to 09 May 2024 at Southern Sun Hotel in OR Tambo.

The EDHE annual Train-the-Trainer workshop targeted educators and support professionals across disciplines responsible for facilitating learning and guiding future teachers under the theme 'Educators for Entrepreneurship.' A total of 18 University of Venda (UNIVEN) staff members participated in the training: 3 senior lecturers, 6 lecturers, 6 junior lecturers, 1 professor, the Deputy Dean of Teaching and Learning (Faculty of Science, Engineering, and Agriculture and the Director (Community Engagement, Entrepreneurship, Inclusive Innovation, and Commercialisation).

The workshop objectives were to equip educational practitioners and teachers to develop changemaker competencies in their learners in a way that is integrated with the main curriculum; to build a network of 'changemakers' who creatively develop entrepreneurial minds and enable young people to thrive by being active contributors of society and develop 21st-century skills to navigate rapid change and thrive in the job market; to empower educators and enhance teaching practices in South Africa; and to equip educators and future teachers with the changemaker skills, tools, committed to creating positive impact in our society. The "Educators for Entrepreneurship" training helps the university's staff members achieve strategic objective 6 of developing an entrepreneurial culture at the University of

The workshop was facilitated by Mr Vipin Thekk, Senior Director and Ashoka's Youth Venture Change Leader at Ashoka, using a unique facilitation approach of combining storytelling, learning from each other, and learning through videos and online exercises. On the first day of the training, Mr Thekk, along with his facilitators, focused on solutions that outpace problems in the dynamic environment. These solutions require effective collaboration between people and the ability to organise into fluid teams. This ensures that every participant in the process is set up to become a contributor, a leader, and a changemaker. He urged the participants to become changemakers in their workplace and home environment and create a world where everyone is a changemaker. He defined a changemaker as anyone who imagines a new reality, acts, and collaborates with others to bring that new reality into being for the good of all parents, students, programmers, nurses, teachers, and neighbours who step up to solve a problem or create an opportunity for the good of all. Mr Thekk introduced the participants to The Togetherness Practice, which is a changemaker's instrument for activating individual and collective potential

On day two of the workshop, Mr Thekk helped the participants explore rational shifts foundational to transformational change. He demonstrated how Ashoka is helping people worldwide become changemakers using the ASHOKA U, which is about changing the frameworks and possibilities of Higher Education, ASHOKA U community of higher education leaders has spent 13 years focusing on Innovation in higher education and graduating millions of changemakers. The self-assessment tool helps educators, universities, and schools empower students, faculty, and staff with evidence-based change-making resources designed to help the institution succeed. It takes an ecosystem to raise a changemaker. To develop an implementation plan for participants who formed part of the annual EDHE train-the-trainer workshop, Mr Thekk and the facilitators divided participants into different groups to reflect on the lessons from the training and come up with ideas of how they are going to drive change in their respective institution

On the sidelines of the workshop, young changemaker Mtha Nazo attendees, including Ms. Tsakani Nyoni, Junior Lecturer in the Department of Indigenous Knowledge Systems and Heritage Studies at the University of Venda. Ms. Nyoni shared her enthusiasm for the workshop, stating that she would share the knowledge and insights gained with her students, aiming to positively impact their lives and inspire them to become agents of change. "The Entrepreneurship for Educators Workshop was engaging. I appreciated how they designed activities that ensured we engaged and built networks with colleagues from other Universities and private sector organizations. We received presentations on how we could train the next generation of Changemakers and engaged in activities on how we would implement changemaking in our classrooms. Some of the key things to note were that the needs and demands of our economies are evolving, and there is a need to incorporate relevant skills into our teaching to ensure that our students are relevant and competitive.

Ms Nyoni further said that our teaching should help students develop problem-solving skills. "This also requires teachers to introduce entrepreneurial projects/initiatives in the classroom, as we are now training the next generation of job creators, problem solvers, and students who can influence positive change within their communities. As teachers/facilitators, we were reminded of the need to reflect on what we know/do not know and to allow ourselves to learn and grow out of our comfort zone."

The University of Venda (UNIVEN) recently signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the South African National Energy Development Institute (SANEDI). Part of the agreement in this MoU is 1 million Rands fund that will benefit Physics students who will be funded from master's to PhD level of their studies. The signing ceremony of this MoU took place at the University's Education Building, Lecture Hall 1.

Prior to the signing ceremony, Head of Energy Secretariat at SANEDI, Prof Sampson Mamphweli addressed the audience on the history of electricity generation in South Africa. He said Eskom started building power stations to supply low-cost electricity. He continued to explain that, as times goes and population grew, the demand of electricity

increased and so did the Eskom activities. "This growth was mainly driven by the growth in the mining and industrial sector as well as urban development. Then there was slow economic growth between 1983 and 1993 associated with the shift in the political landscape of the country. This led to low demand in electricity as well especially in the mining sector. During this period, Eskom had to decommission, and they had to resort to mothballing some of the power stations until 1995." Professor Mamphweli continued his explanation and illustrated that, at this time, less than 13 million South Africans (40% of the population) had access to electricity. He further narrated on the fact that, Eskom then started a programme to electrify villages and townships across the country to increase access to affordable electricity.

In 2002, Eskom was restructured as a public company, Eskom Holdings Limited, and this company relied primarily on coal for electricity production until the South African government published a white paper on renewable energy in 2003. This white paper flagged the project shortage of generation capacity by 2007/8. He said they were serious delays in the introduction of renewable energy in the country until government published the Integrated Resource Plan (IRP2010-2030) that set a target of 14725 Megawatts renewable energy contribution.

When talking about challenges of security electricity supply Prof Mamphweli highlighted that loadshedding disrupts our daily life and it causes inconvenience to individuals. He indicated that, companies were closed, and people lost jobs because of loadshedding. "There is a dire need to urgently attend to loadshedding because it also aggravates socioeconomic inequalities. If we can secure the supply of energy in our industries, we could have a strong economy."

He indicated that there is also a need to open for the private sector to provide energy.

"We will soon be running the future power system using the available technologies of today." He then indicated that Eskom returned several units that were down for maintenance to service, and they have proven to be reliable, adding about 3000 Megawatts to the grid. "This is also because of the growth in rooftop solar photovoltaic from households and small businesses. It has resulted in lower electricity demand."

"There is a dire need to urgently attend to load-shedding because it also aggravates socioeconomic inequalities. If we can secure the supply of energy in our industries, we could have a strong economy."



The Deputy Vice-Chancellor Corporate Services, Dr Robert Martin (on the photo above) said this event is one of the most important events of this University. The MoU between the two parties will benefit students and staff members. Dr Martin said students should not only focus on studies, he told them that they should also know that there is life after university life which we need to prepare for while we are still students. "UNIVEN is excited about this collaboration because it fits well in the Strategic Plan of this University. This MoU also resonates well with the Centre for Entrepreneurship and Rapid Incubation of this University. We want to teach the world on how to make impact and how to serve the world."

When announcing the areas of collaborations, CEO of SANEDI, Dr Titus Mathe said coal will be with us for the next 100 years to come. He also presented SANEDI's competitive advantages. He presented about what SANEDI wants to achieve and its objectives, missions, and visions.

Prof Bernard Nthambeleni thanked SANEDI colleagues for thinking about UNIVEN when they thought of a University to partner with. We believe this MoU will bear the intended fruits because at UNIVEN we fulfil our promises.

Prof Eric Maluta said the 1 million Rands will assist students in physics who will be funded from master's to PhD level. "The University of Venda has a plan for making the campus to be green, by starting to build a 1 megawatts solar plant, which is aimed to be 5 megawatts solar plant". The energy will also be used to assist the communities around the University.



SAF-ADAPT Teachers' Climate Change Training Workshop



Prof. N.S. Nethengwe's South Africa/Flanders Climate Adaptation Research and Training Partnership (SAF-ADAPT) Project in the Department of Geography and Environmental Sciences hosted a Climate Change Teachers' Training Workshop on May 15, 2024. Funded by the Government of Flanders through the African Climate and Development Initiative (ACDI) at the University of Cape Town, the workshop addressed the pressing need for early climate change education as articulated in the objectives — enhancing teachers' understanding of climate change, providing practical teaching tools, demonstrating the use of Geographic Information Systems (GIS)

in teaching, and fostering a collaborative network of educators committed to climate change education. The workshop attracted thirty-six educators (20 females and 16 males) from Vhembe District Municipality teaching Geography and/or Natural Sciences Grades 7–10). Educators at deep rural schools were mostly selected to ensure that even the most marginalised learners receive essential climate change knowledge.

Educators went through several engaging, interactive, and practical sessions covering fundamental climate science by Mr. Mavhungu Muthige, adaptation, mitigation,

and resilience by Dr. Ephias Mugari, togetherness practice in climate change by Prof. Nthaduleni Nethengwe, and GIS applications by Ms. Grace Maponya and Mr. Dion Gumbo. These facilitators from the Department of Geography and Environmental Sciences successfully provided participants with the knowledge and tools needed to teach climate change effectively, fostering a network of educators equipped to integrate climate change concepts into their curricula. Participants appreciated the interactive nature of the sessions, the expertise of the facilitators, and the practical applications of the knowledge gained and

requested for more frequent workshops, extended practical sessions, and additional resources to support ongoing climate change education efforts. Looking ahead, we plan to make this a departmental initiative and organise more workshops, develop localised teaching materials, extend outreach to local communities, and advocate for the inclusion of comprehensive climate change topics in the school curriculum from early grades. This would contribute to building a generation of environmentally conscious youths capable of addressing climate challenges effectively.
