


### **UIGC, UCE GIVE BACK ON MANDELA DAY WITH FREE E-COURSE**

### UCE, UNIVEN partner on GBV prevention, victim support project

DC Academy has successfully delivered similar programmes for SASSETA in the past and was expected to provide technical and operational support to ensure effective project delivery, stated UCE Operations Manager Thanyani Nekwakwani.

The project will include stakeholder engagement, the recruitment of 400 participants to include 100 GBV victims, a 2-day workshop, the implementation of awareness campaigns and the provision of support sessions for 100 GBV victims.
