# A Bridge of Cultures: UNIVEN Students Discover China's Language, Heritage, and Innovation

From 18 June to 2 July 2025, the Green Technology Confucius Institute (GTCI) at the University of Venda led a 15-day educational and cultural exchange programme in China, themed "Song of the Yangtze River: China-South Africa Civilisation Mutual Learning Exploration." Eleven students from UNIVEN participated in the "Chinese Bridge" initiative, hosted by Hubei University of Technology (HBUT), immersing

themselves in Chinese language, culture, and technology.

The programme featured intensive language training through a Hanyu Shuiping Kaoshi (HSK) preparation course and deep dives into traditional culture, calligraphy, tea ceremonies, and historical furniture at the Muyan Hall Museum.



Students engaged in intercultural dialogue with Chinese peers at the Sino-SA Youth Civilisation Dialogue Forum, sharing Venda traditions and South African urban life.





On the technology front, they toured innovation hubs, 3D printing labs, and photovoltaic training bases, gaining exposure to China's renewable energy and smart technologies, including

vehicles and e-agriculture autonomous systems.





Cultural exploration included visits to historic sites along the Yangtze River in Wuhan and Yichang, including the Yellow Crane Tower and the monumental Three Gorges Dam. The exchange deepened mutual understanding and symbolised a lasting bond between the civilisations nurtured by the Yangtze and Limpopo Rivers.

# **Types of Contributions**

# Contributed Paper 🖺 🔏 👑

The paper may present findings from a research study, a case report, or the application of a particular methodology in practice. It could also explore theoretical and conceptual issues relevant to the conference's theme and subthemes.

This is a collegial discussion of a topic relevant to the conference theme and subthemes by several discussants. The outline for such a presentation should describe the topic and the central issues that will be explored.

### Pre-Conference Workshop 💢 🚟 🤝

A workshop should actively engage participants in discussing a topic aligned with the conference theme and subthemes. It must include a short introduction and clearly planned interactive activities. The outline should detail the topic, target audience, participant involvement, and intended outcomes.

## Poster Presentation 🖾 🗯 🚮

Posters can depict research or evaluation findings, outline a research process, or describe a program. The presenter(s) will be available at the poster for discussion at a specific time.

### Demonstration 💡 🥒 💻

A demonstration displays materials related to a project, research or practice. These may include a variety of formats, such as computer programs or multimedia presentations of a project.
